

What's involved?

Contact:

A Maryknoll Vocation Minister will respond to your initial inquiry with a phone call or personal visit.

Discernment & Orientation:

Maryknoll encourages a discernment program to help you clarify your motives and look at the reality of mission overseas.

Afterwards, if you and Maryknoll agree you are ready, you will participate in a mission orientation program at Maryknoll, NY, prior to your departure on overseas assignment.

Common agreement:

You, your bishop or religious superior and Maryknoll sign a three-way contract.

Assignment:

Every consideration will be given to your preference of mission area. However, all missionaries are expected to be open to assignment in any country where Maryknoll serves.

Financial support:

Maryknoll assumes full responsibility for your financial support during your orientation and while you are under contract. In addition to living expenses and full medical coverage, you will receive a monthly personal allowance equal to that received by Maryknoll Priests and Brothers.

Vacation and Furlough:

Each year you are entitled to a one-month vacation. At the end of three years, you receive a two-month furlough in the United States. You may request additional time for the purpose of sharing your overseas experiences with the people here at home.

Who's eligible?

- A Priest or Brother ordained or professed for at least three to five years

- and if you have the permission of your bishop or religious superior.
